A Global Educational Workshop titled "Exploring New Trends and Trajectories in Higher Education" was recently organized by Educators Without Borders, Geneva. The workshop was held on 28th April 2024 at Demora, Calicut. The workshop brought together distinguished educators and scholars to discuss and explore innovative approaches and emerging trends in higher education. The event took place over two days and featured insightful presentations and interactive sessions led by experts from around the world. Dr. Nasr M. Arif, an eminent figure in the field of global education, initiated the workshop with a keynote address. He focused on the evolving landscape of higher education in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA) region. His talk highlighted the challenges and opportunities that arise in integrating modern educational practices within traditional educational systems. Christine Housel's presentation explored how global ethics can be integrated into curricula to prepare students for the complexities of a globalized world. She addressed the importance of instilling ethical reasoning in students to help them navigate the moral challenges they may face in their professional lives. Dr. Abbas Panakkal presented on the intersection of technology and education, focusing on how digital transformation is reshaping higher education globally. Dr. Archan Mitra concluded the workshop with a session on the evolving role of media in higher education. He examined the impact of digital media on teaching and learning processes, and how media literacy is becoming an essential skill for both educators and students. From Farm to Factory: Nile Experience

On 29th June 2024, the IV semester BCom Finance students of CPA College conducted an Industrial visit to Nile Food Products, a prominent food processing company located in Idukki. The visit was organized as part of their academic curriculum to provide students with real-world insights into the operations of a manufacturing industry. The students, accompanied by faculty members, reached the Nile Food Products factory in the morning, where they were warmly welcomed by the company's management team. The visit began with a presentation about the company's history, its product range, and its role in the food processing industry. Nile Food Products is known for producing high-quality spices, condiments, and processed foods, leveraging the rich agricultural resources of the Idukki region. The students were then taken on a guided tour of the manufacturing plant, where they observed the various stages of production, from raw material procurement to processing, packaging, and quality control. The company's operations team explained the machinery used for drying, grinding, and packaging, emphasizing the importance of hygiene and food safety standards. The students gained practical knowledge of how raw materials are transformed into finished goods, along with insights into inventory management, logistics, and supply chain processes. This session was particularly beneficial for the BCom Finance students, as it gave them a closer look at how financial principles are applied in a real-world business setting. 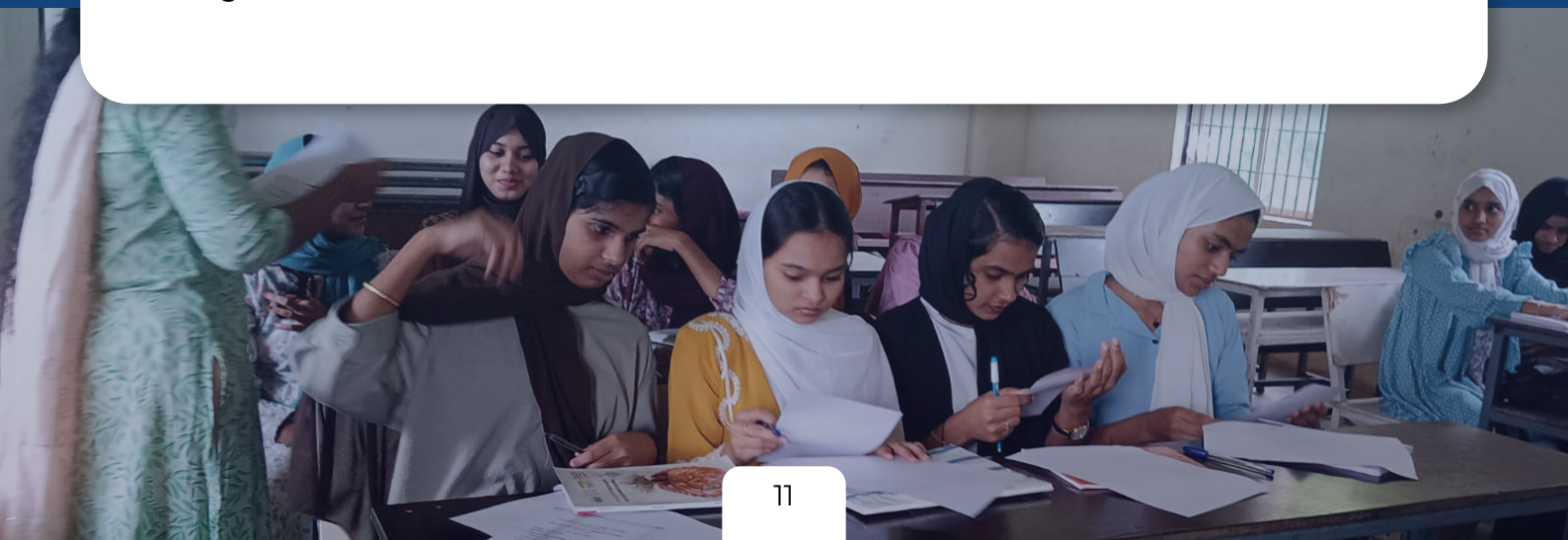
LED Tech Workshop: Assembling & Repairing Basics

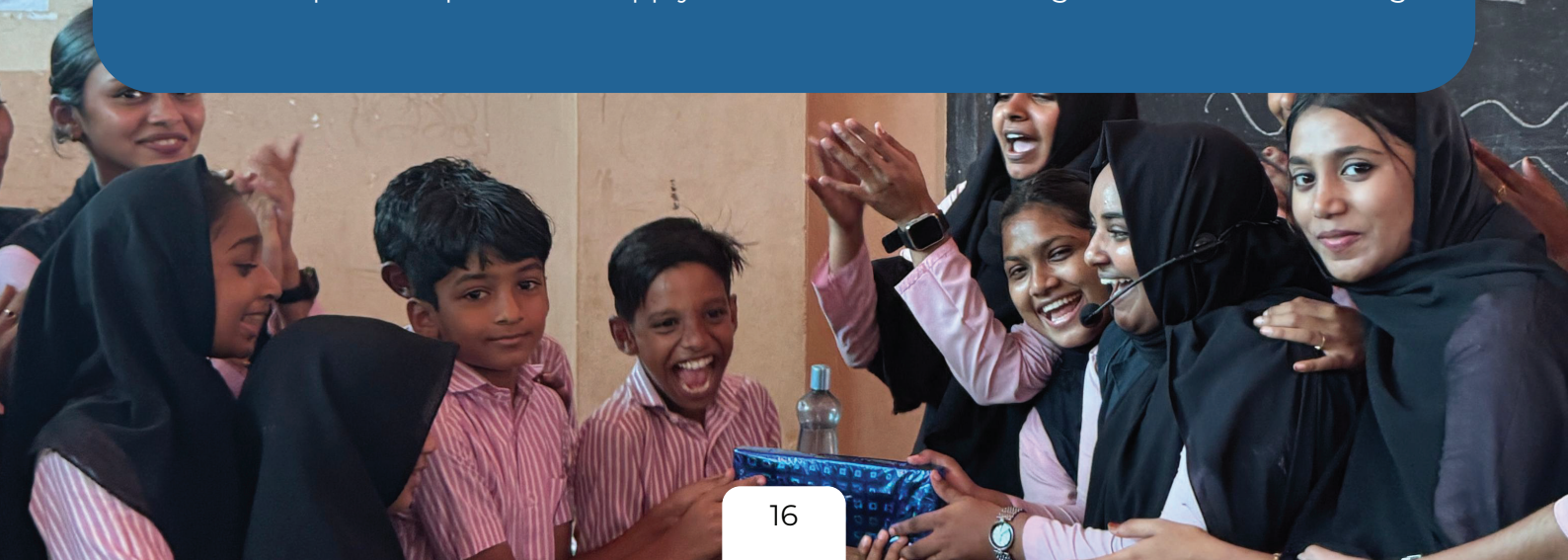
United Against Ragging

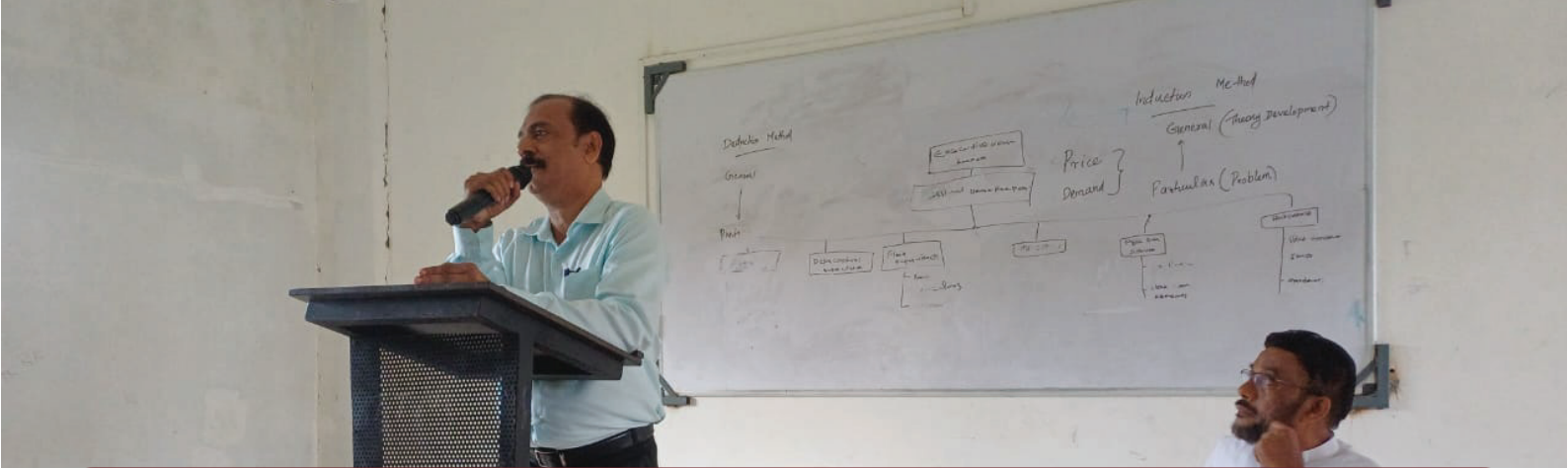
An Anti-Ragging Awareness Programme was successfully conducted at CPA College of Global Studies on 16th August 2024. The programme aimed to educate students about the dangers of ragging, its legal implications, and the importance of creating a safe and respectful environment on campus. The event was inaugurated by Mr. Saleem K, Inspector of Police, Kalpakanchery, who emphasized the need for strict enforcement of anti-ragging laws to ensure the safety and well-being of students. 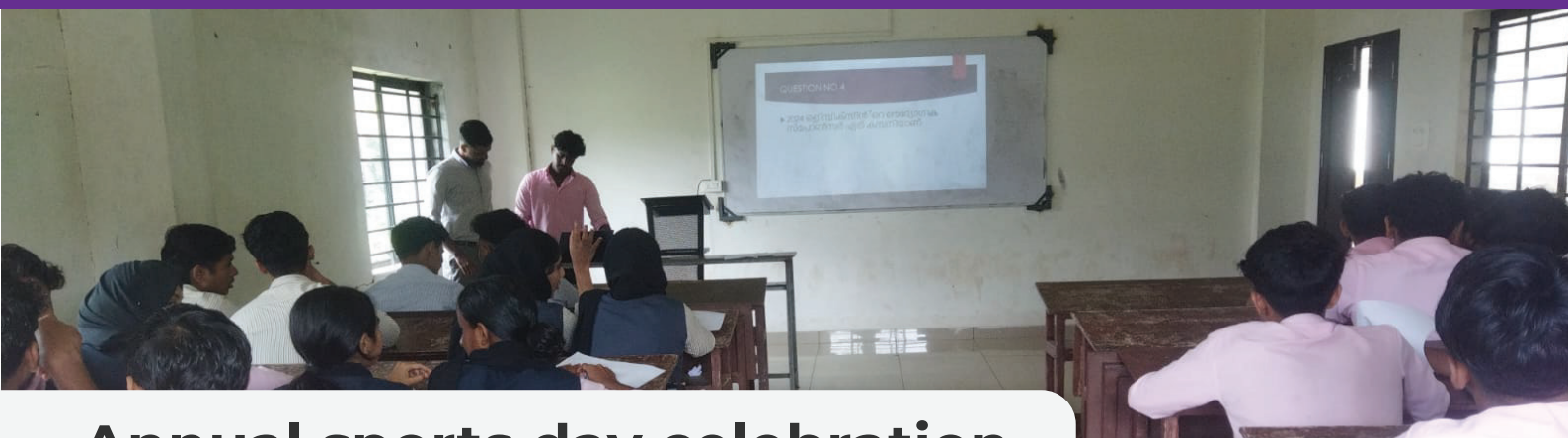

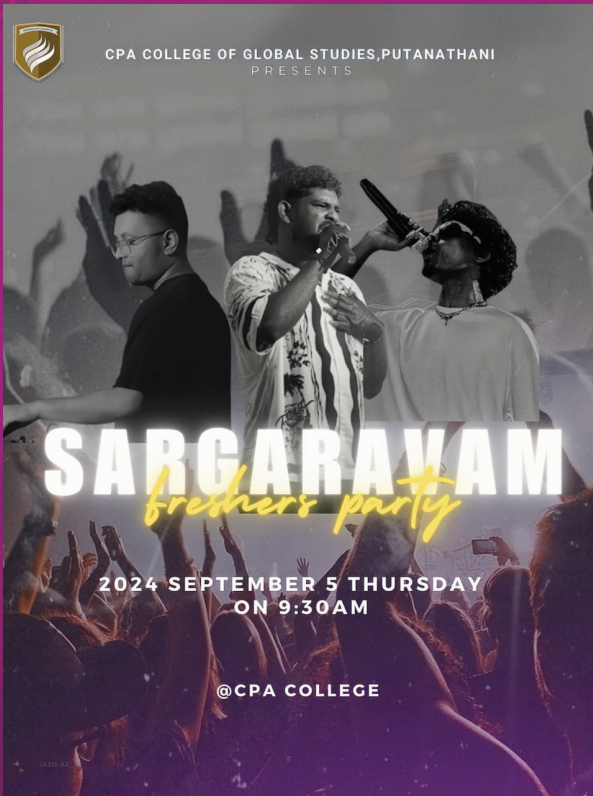
A Literary Adventure to Book Farm

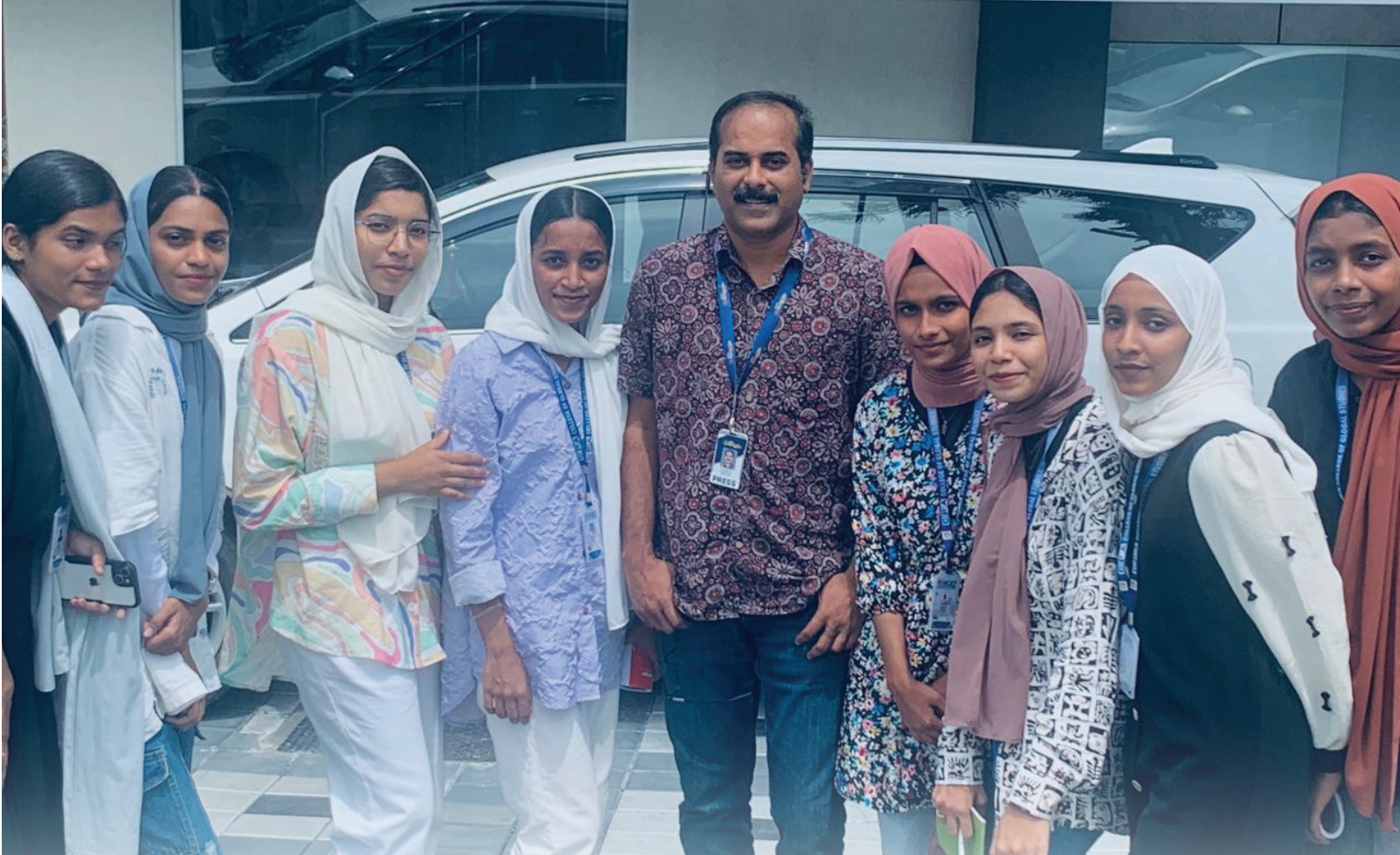
Sargaravam: Embrace the Journey
