

Venue: MUNNADI VILLAGE, PUTHANATHANI Objective:

- 1. To expose the students to the real time experience in a village area to know their problems.
- 2. To educate the age-old people about the importance of educating their children for a better future.
- 3. To alert the remote women about the importance of good health and hygiene for a better life.
- 4. To extend a helping hand by distributing a few basic requirements related to the theme.

Outcome:

- 1. Students who visited the remote understood that there are people in and around who need little more attention.
- 2. Students were thankful to the College, JCI and the Department for giving them a chance to know the social problems.
- 3. Students' initiative to educate the women helped themself to know more about the theme.
- 4. Apart from studies the students got a chance to extend a helping hand to the needy slum women, at least on a small scale with the sponsorship and support of the college.

The extension activity was undertaken on 23-07-2019 at 2pm at MOONADI where more than 30 students who belong to the Department of English of 3rd and 2nd year volunteered to visit the village. Students who volunteered for the visit made a thorough preparation to make their visit a useful one hence, planned various activities which includes talk by Asha P., HoD, Department of English, on both the themes, 1 skit was performed by students in Malayalam on the theme so that the women would understand better about the need of self-dependency. Two students gave a talk on the theme one in Malayalam language which made all the difference. Lower primary Students participated in a game activity and distributed prizes for the first 3 places. College management provided a bus facility for the students to reach out to the spot and then back to college. .



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
