CPA College of Global Studies, located amidst the flora and fauna of nature, is a fast-emerging resourceful destination for higher studies. This esteemed institution has been successfully serving the society for the last few years. It is run by NICE Educational Trust Puthanathani with Janab. C.P Abdu Rahman Haji Kuttur as its Chairman and Founder Patron. Dr. Hussain Randathani, an eminent educationist serves as the Director and Secretary of the College. The College was officially inaugurated by Dr. K T Jaleel (MLA, Thavanur Constituency).



CPA College of Global Studies is located at Puthanathani, Malappuram, Kerala, India. The campus is just one Kilometer away from the National Highway Road. The picturesque site and blossoming green environment make the campus free from pollution. The college, a self-financing institution, is affiliated to the University of Calicut and approved by the Government of Kerala. The college started functioning with three UG Programmes namely, B. Com Cooperation, BBA and BA Functional English with 85 students. Initially the college name was CPA College of arts and science and it was renamed to 'CPA College of Global Studies' in 2020. The college was started with a single floor building on 2012. After six years it was renovated to extra three buildings with more space and facilities.

At present there are Nine UG and three PG programmes. The campus is spread across a vast area of nine acres of green land with shrubs, herbs and trees. The campus had well-arranged infra structure with all the modern facilities, have a spacious building with facilities of smart classrooms, digital library, playground, canteen, open auditorium, update hall, laboratory and prayer hall. The college provides Bus facility to girl students. Now there are 49 faculty members from different streams, administrative staffs, security staffs and staff for menial works.

CPA believes in nurturing a holistic education, which is about honing every facet of a student, helping an individual develop life-skills, a spirit of enquiry and research. Beyond learning in the classroom and laboratories, the college has developed a mechanism to introduce each student to a wide range of co-curricular activities. PRINCIPAL AND STAFF

Head of the institution is Principal. He has to facilitate and monitor the academic activities of the college, day to day management of infrastructure, finance, human resource, and general discipline in the campus are also his domain. The principal supervises all the academic activities of the college. Since an institution of higher learning is administrated based on certain lofty values, concepts and conventions of a civilized society rather than on force and power, the leadership functions of a principal is indeed onerous. He is a brilliant scholar hailing from Randathani had his primary school locally and higher education at Aligarh Muslim University and doctorate from the University of Calicut. Well known for his scholarly work in provincial history, he is also a social activist of repute. He is a prolific writer and broadcaster and has travelled widely. This rich background makes him a man of vision and seasoned administrator and helps him to carry out his present responsibilities with elan.

The principal is assisted by Vice Principal in the Academic matters and Superintendent in administrative matters. The appointments and salary fixation and other financial matters are done by the secretary and the management in consultation with principal.

The Vice Principal deals with the duty of the teachers and coordinates the activities of different sections and keeps the academic calendar of the college followed strictly. He represents the principal in different bodies and supervises the admission and facilities of the college. The Vice Principal acts as an Academic Coordinator to monitor the academic matters connected with the facilities of the students, tutorial system, remedial measures and discipline of the students. Here in the college the Vice Principal also supervise the accounts of the college as per the instruction of the Managing Committee.

There is a Nodal officer who is appointed as per the order of the university to act as a link between the college and University in the case of admissions and examinations. He also acts as the Public Relations officer of the college as per the University norms. The Superintendent is the head of the office. He regulates the working of the office regarding the correspondence, tuition fees, exam fees, fines, admission, TC, university and govt. orders, canteen, accounts, donations, vehicle, salary, taxes, construction accounts, purchase, stock, audit etc. He is assisted by two clerks one connected with accounts and other with academics. Besides, the department activities are coordinated by the Head of the departments who forms a department council with his department colleagues. The HOD entrust the activities connected with the attendance, tutorial, tour, examinations, uniform, discipline, clubs and extension activities to the faculty members in his departments. Each department keep a Department Diary to note the day-to-day events and flow of the work. It is to be submitted to the principal at the end of the semester and whenever asked by him. There is a faculty for Physical Education to foster the sports spirit among the students. Other staff in the college includes an Accountant, librarian, system administrator, lab assistants, attender, driver, security and scavenger. The principal also appoints coordinators for different extension and co-curricular activities from the faculty members.

It is the faculty led by the principal who hold the key to decision- making process in the college. While the managements limit their role to major policy decisions and raising financial resources, all other important decisions regarding the affairs of the college are left to the faculties and the principal who go about it in the most democratic manner. The management scrupulously avoids interfering in the day to day running of the institution and expects the faculty to take decision and implement them and the faculty on their part, strives to discharge the responsibilities ensuring the health and growth of the institution.


STUDENTS' DETAILS





STUDENT SUPPORTING PROGRAMMES


The soul of any educational institution lies in the opportunities and satisfaction of children. Adequate opportunities and student supporting programmes should be envisaged if we intend to upgrade the performance and competence of students. Student group in any college is a diversity where we can see and interact with students from different backgrounds and regions. Supporting students from underprivileged backgrounds is one of the major thoughts of the college especially for SC, ST and other minorities. When it comes to providing equal opportunities, the college is supposed be inventive and take upper hand in activating and monitoring certain special programmes, same is the intention of our college here; to be unable to refrain from lending a hand to needed students. A holistic development is what we look at here. Besides affiliating to the university, continuous training and counseling is given to the students through parallel curriculum to equip them with a higher stage of excellence.

TUTORIALSYSTEM

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Tutorial is an important teaching-learning tool. It helps learners enhance their intellectual, communication and social skills. It also ensures individual and unique learning experience, one-on-one attention, improves academic performance, improves attitude towards learning, encourages self-paced and self-directed learning, improves self-esteem and confidence, improves work and study habits and provides positive work space.

The tutorial system is designed to keep the relationship between the students and the teachers in a systemic and meaningful manner. The aim of the tutorial system is to help the students to improve their cognitive and other academic abilities and analyses the progress of the students, the circumstances of the students' dwellings, mental and physical health, the need of counseling, Academic audit of each student, need of remedial measures, indiscipline, etc. The system is a pyramid like structure starting from the Principal to the student as shown below



In each class there will be a Chief Student Coordinator and one Assistant Coordinator. The Chief Coordinator keeps a Student's Diary for each class. In the diary he has to record the day today events and details of the class taken in each hour. For each class a Tutor has been appointed. Every week the Tutor has to sign the diary at the end of the week and the HODs at the end of each month. The Chief Tutor examines the diary and comments on the activities and makes suggestions. The Coordinator has to keep the class room clean and hygienic and to organize debates and discussions and quiz competitions at least twice in a month in the presence of the Tutor. Each Tutor keeps a register dealing with the biography and overall performance of the students. He also keeps a diary to note the activities of the class. The Chief Tutor holds meetings with the coordinators under the supervision of the Principal to discuss the progress of the class, module plans and give proper suggestions and instruction.

If any teacher found weak in the duties or non-competent as per the suggestions given by the students, matter is discussed with the principal and actions are taken. It is the duty of the Chief Tutor to assess the examinations held in each class and the state of the student result after consulting with the tutor. Remedial teaching is also the part of a Tutorial system, which promotes individual attention and discipline. There will be frequent meetings of Coordinators, Tutors and HODs called by the Principal for discussing the academic progress of the students. The Academic Coordinator coordinates all the academic activities of the college.

Tutorials can be spaces where students are grouped in smaller numbers and can be guided to make sense of the work, practice their skills, cultivate critical thinking and learn from and with each other. In the academic year (2022-23), there were conducted monthly Coordinator's meetings. The class coordinators actively participated in it. In the first meeting, the Principal detailed about the duties and responsibilities of the class Coordinators and module plans were distributed to them. At the end of each month, the Coordinators were asked if the classes were going according to the module plan. Teachers who could not complete the portion according to the module plan were asked to complete the portion in a timely manner, and also tried to ensure that notes and dot notes reached the students accurately. Different class room activities such as debate, discussions, guiz competitions, etc. were conducted in the tutorial hours and kept a notebook that to record the activities and the students' progress. The tutors identified the problems of wards and tried to solve them. Monthly Exams and Internal exams were conducted and identified the backward ward and took necessary steps for remedial coaching. Necessary revision was also done during the University exams. In this way the Coordinators were able to reach out to the whole class and find and solve their problems.

2. PTA - Parent Teachers Association

The college has an active Parents Teachers Association (PTA) that provides remarkable support to the routine functioning of the college. The PTA assists the overall development of the students by extending financial and other supports to the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities of the students. There are sixteen executive committee members with the principal as the president and a parent as vice president. Secretary of the management also takes a seat in the body's decision making. Principal will be the President of the PTA and a parent is selected as Vice President. The secretary ship also goes to a staff member as per the norms. This body discusses every issue connected with the college and gives suggestions. A membership of Rs.2000/- is to be given as membership fee by each parent during the admission of their wards. The fund is utilized for helping the poor students, for purchasing books, for giving support to the staffs and for other purposes decided by the committee.

The PTA executive normally convenes thrice in a year. Department wise PTA and Class wise PTA are held thrice in a year. In the beginning of the year a combined grouping of the parents and students of each department is organized. There will be parenting classes in the general meeting, and class PTA will be held in the presence of parent, teacher, tutor and the student. The parents can come with their opinions and suggestions in the class wise meeting and they will be discussed in the executive meeting for solution.

The PTA system of a college builds to encourage and promote good relationship among the members of the teaching faculties, students and parents/guardians of the students. All the teachers of the college and guardians of the students of the institution are members of the PTA. It is necessary to create in its members enthusiastic interest for the smooth working and the progress of the institution and for maintaining good discipline and high academic standards. The main objective of the PTA is to create better understanding between parents and teachers and harmonious relationship between the institution and community.

There were four PTA Meetings and four Executive meetings were conducted in the academic year 2022-2023.

Mr.Ebrahim Kutty sir, HOD of Department of Zoology extended the gratitude to all by sharing vote of thanks.



3. STAFF COUNCIL

The Staff Council meeting of the college is conducted once in a month. All the important decisions regarding academics are taken in staff council meeting. All the Faculties have an Academic Plan which they follow that academic year. 4. COLLEGE COUNCIL

The basic aim behind the cell is to identify academically backward students and provide remedial measures for improving their performance. To meet out the educational requirement of students who are with poor educational back ground and slow learners, the college has started the cell to reduce the students' failure and dropout rates. The center for remedial coaching cell is providing remedial teaching for various subjects, language proficiency and personality development classes. With the start of healthy and student friendly cell in the college these learners are encouraged to compete with the rest of the students. Almost all the subjects are covered under this scheme taking into consideration of demand and need of the students with all necessary facilities. To meet the educational requirement of students with poor educational back ground .To reduce the students' failure and dropout rates, a centre for remedial coaching was started with the objective of organizing remedial coaching at under graduate level. The centre for remedial coaching and counselling is providing remedial teaching for various subjects, language proficiency and personality development classes. 41

MENTOR AND MENTEE SYSTEM

The goal of the mentoring programme is to establish a trusting relationship with accountability and responsibility from the mentor and mentee. The mentor has chalked out responsibilities to take care of all the mentees such as to provide them career counselling to provide them personal counselling, to support them for any kind of difficulty in their curriculum, to make provision of remedial coaching for them and to always support them as and when required. In this context mentoring of students is immensely important. So, the faculty members try to informally mentor the students. Mentor's help students interpret undergraduate program guidelines and clarify different aspects of curriculum. They constantly encourage students to come forward with their ideas at all stages of development. Students are motivated to expand their skills. Faculty members are approachable and help in advancing the academic and professional goals through sharing guidance, experience and expertise. Students come from an increasingly diverse background; therefore, teachers personally interact and try to help them to adapt to changes in a graceful manner.

Remedial Classes are organized on working days after the regular teaching hours of the college are completed. Remedial coaching classes are completed before the commencement of exams and model question papers are solved with the students by the respective subject teachers. The system of remedial teaching is practiced to make up the intelligent students of the same class are advised to assist to conducting remedial classes on holidays and free periods for weak students.

The Cell is aimed to identify the learning difficulties in the student. Once identified, the teacher needs to administer the remedial teaching while being aware of these difficulties. In a majority of cases, it is seen to have a positive impact on the student. Based on the internal assessment slow, average and above average learners are identified from second year and final year students and due attention is provided for their areas of weakness and given good assistance. Special attention is established by furnishing micro notes and small learning modules for the students in a flexible time frame.

Coordinator will be responsible for coordination and ensure effective implementation of the coaching program, in addition to actual teaching in the classes provided revision classes to students before the university exam on the basis of special time table. The mentor also works for finding out hidden talents of the students in various aspects of academic, co-curricular, extra- curricular and extra mural activities so that they can be promoted to do various activities in the concerned area for their holistic development.

"Perspectives of Outcome Based Education and NAAC Accreditation"



CURTAIN CALL



1. RESEARCH STATION VISITS/INSTITUTIONAL VISIT


Third semester and fifith semester degree students and two faculties went to Malabar Botanical Garden and Institute for Plant Science (MBGIPS) at Olavanna Kozhikode district. As a part of our curriculum sixth semester students visited Goa Central University on 11th January 2023. Students visited different research labs like plant physiology, Fungi and pathology and taxonomy lab. Sixth semester students visited NIO (National Institute of Oceanography, India) on 11th January 2023. Students got the opportunity to visit the museum (collection of rocks or mineral sediments or fossils from ocean) and aquarium. As a part of plant breeding sixth semester students along with three faculties visited CCRI (Central Coffee Research Institute) on 13th January. The institute is involved in intensive research in the disciplines of plant breeding, agronomy, agricultural chemistry & Soil Science, Plant physiology, pathology, entomology and Post – Harvest technology. Sixth semester and second semester MSc students participated in botanical garden exhibition on 10th March 2023. As a part of curriculam second MSc students visited CMPR (Centre for Medicinal Plantnts Research, Arya Vaidya Sala Kottakkal) Kottakkal - Tissue culture lab.

2. FIELD VISITS AND COLLECTION

As a part of curriculum second MSc students and two faculties conducted a field visit and collection of angiosperm on 21st June 2022. So many plant specimens collected for herbarium preparation and preservation. Department conducted a field visit on 4th November 2022 to Thikkodi for algal collection and preservation. Thirteen students and three faculties went for the collection. Students collected around nine species of algae including genus Sargassum, Gracilaria, Ulva, Padina, Caulerpa, Dictyota, Chaetophora. All collected specimens were preserved for further studies and each students prepared five hebarium specimens for submission. As part of curriculum 1st MSc students and Two faculties conducted a field visit and collection of pteridophytes on 14th December 2022. Seven specimens got collected for herbarium preparation and submission. Sixth semester students along with three faculties left for Mullayanagiri peak, Karnataka on 14th January 2023. Students collected different angiosperm specimens from the area. As a part of curriculam sixth semester students along with three faculties conducted a field visit to Goa, Dandeli, Chikmanglur and Coorg on 10 th – 15th January 2023. Students collected some algal specimens like Sargassum and angiosperm specimens for herbarium submission and for further studies. As a part of the update course our 6th semester students attended a placement training camp on Oct 15 & 16 at Malayil farm house, Pang Malappuram district. The camp was basically the personality development training. Students studied about the attending an interview, resume preparation, presentation skills etc.

Students attended the invited lecture on Dec 6th "Lichenology", It was conducted by Department of Botany as a part Indian Botanical Society Foundation Day celebration by Calicut University. first MSc students attended an invited lecture on "Micro RNA(miRNAs)in plants" by Prof. Ramanjulu Sunkar at Department of Botany, University of Calicut on 15 th February 2023. Five first MSc students attended an invited one day workshop on "TAXONOMY AND BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION "by KCSTE-KFRI on 20th February 2023 Mubeena K. and Jaseela Ameer participated THE QUEST Intercollegiate Quiz competition conducted by Department of Zoology at MES College Ponnani on Feb 23rd 2023. 

ECO LIVING WORKSHOP




PATHWAY- SOCIAL LIFE WELLNESS PROGRAMME.

We started the journey at 6 am and we returned at 9.00 pm. Firstly, the team d Kerala puppetry at vaniyamkulam. Viswanatha Pulavar, the artist of Tholapavakoothu said that it will take a minimum of 20 years dedication to master the art form. In India, shadow puppetry is known by different names regionally, like 'tholu bommalata' in Andhra Pradesh, 'togalu gombeyaata'. As a very old traditional art form, this art form sounds simple on hearing, but the technique and interpretation of stories/ episodes, communicating and transferring the concepts do not seem easy. Perfect coordination, practice and dexterity is required to move and manipulate the puppets. Rama's pursuit to catch the golden deer, ten-headed Ravana's appearance, Jatayu's valiant effort to save Sita from Ravana, jubilant dance in Lanka, the realistic fight scene between Vali and Sugriva, Indrajith's magic tricks, and the final battle ensuing Rama's success and his coronation – every frame looked amazingly real and the audience were left in awe and admiration for the deft presentation of story through narration and action of puppets. students got an opportunity to make the puppets of Tholapavakoothu that are made up of deer skin. The figures are drawn on the skin, cut and embellished with dots, lines and holes. The arms of the puppets are made movable. The expression on the faces of the puppets is decided after considering what they would be enacting. This Centre is famous for creating and colouring the puppets they make around three hundred puppets a year.


After the breakfast students went to the next destination, Kerala kalamandalam we reached at 11am there. Kerala Kalamandalam is one of those last remaining places which still hold true to the traditions and culture of Kerala. This world-renowned institution has been imparting cultural education and training to interested individuals in the various art-forms of Kerala. This institute is responsible for preserving the culture of Kerala in its dance forms like Kathakali, Mohiniyaattam and Panchavaadyam. Located in the beautiful and scenic village of Cheruthuruthy, it is the perfect place for the artists to practice. Even though it is located in a rather traditional place, but the Kerala Kalamandalam has been pretty open about its recruitment process. It focusses more on their merit rather than their cultural background, language or religion. Learn about the various artistic dance forms being taught here. We could enjoy the cultural diversity and uniqueness of Kerala, Visit the art gallery, which displays the various head gears, jewelry and costumes that form a critical part of these classical dances. The Kalamandalam has succeeded beautifully in its mission to educate the youth about the rich cultural.

Then the team moved to varikkasseri mana, alternatively known as Varikkumanchery Mana, is one of the oldest traditional aristocratic Namboothiri family houses in Kerala. Built in Kerala architectural style on a plot of land measuring approximately 4 acres, the building is located at Manissery, a village in Ottapalam in Palakkad. It is a popular shooting location for Malayalam films and several commercially successful films such as Devasuram, Aaraam Thampuran, Rappakal were filmed on its premises.

At 3.30 PM The team reached at Asha handlooms at Thiruvillwamala. It has been in the field of production of Kerala Traditional handlooom clothes for the past 3 decades. It played a significant role in making Kuthampully Kasavu Sarees, Set mundus and Dhoties world famous. They are pioneers in Designer sarees which has a unique flavour of latest trends compiled with Kerala tradition made to reality with the craftmanship of weavers.

The last destination was Ananganadi mala. The Anangan hills, popularly known as Ananganmala, are 2500 acres of rocky formation interspersed with lush green forests, with a variety of local wildlife. It stretches north-south for approximately 20 km and at its highest point stands at about 1200 metres. The Anangan hills has an ecotourism Centre.

This trip was really beneficial to the students and they could understand the value of heritable places and the pain and efforts of the artists who are taking for the traditional artistic forms. The students could recognize the necessity to preserve it.




BIODIVERSITY CLUB


MANNASORRUKKAM

FIRST AID TRAINING CAMP








CPA CONVOCATION 2K23
