## Nurturing minds through academic perspective

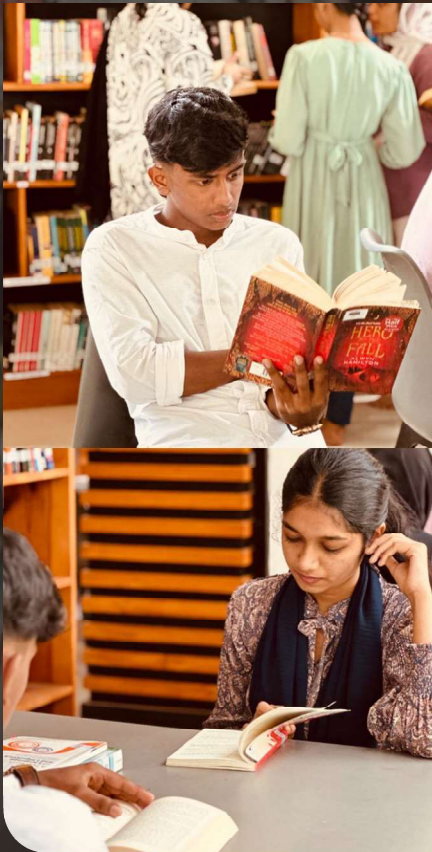

## National Workshop on IPR and Innovations

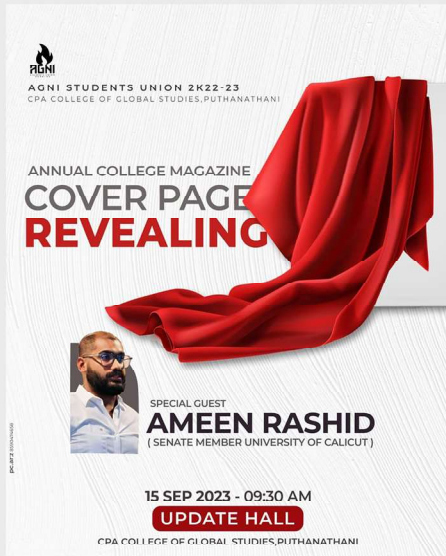
